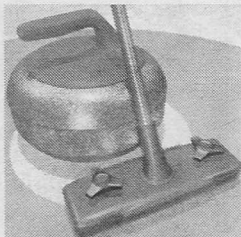


# Curling warms up with full schedule and lots of fun

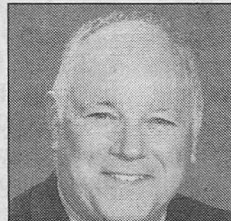
